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PETER HACKHOFER





y father's fascination with magic was ignited by a magic set received for Christmas in 1952. In retrospect, this box was more than just a toy; it marked the beginning of a lifelong passion. My aunts often recounted his first performances in the living room, card tricks were later complicated by risky effects with flash paper and fire. The lifespan of an unsuspecting curtain was cut short by one of the latter. And so my grandparents encouraged him to pursue his passion outside of the house.

During his school years he performed in student pubs and on smaller stages, and up to that point, his career path resembled that of many professional magicians. But other interests came to dominate his career path. In the late 1960s, he began studying sports science and German, followed thereafter by a degree in medicine from the University of Cologne. After several years in intensive care medicine and surgery, he took over a general and sports medicine practice in rural St. Wendel. But his most fulfilling professional pursuit was discovered shortly thereafter in the care and support of terminal patients at the local hospice, a task he dedicated himself to with great devotion even after retirement. The art of providing comfort and peace was perhaps one of his greatest magical achievements.

Collecting was also an innate passion. Like many of his generation, my father started collecting stamps, later expanding his interests to magic books and posters. His enthusiasm eventually extended to two overlapping areas, as well: circus and variety shows. After my parents were married, the scope and size of his collection became even more astonishing to my mother, Barbara, as it all but outgrew their home.

As such, the idea of selling less important parts of the collection to make space quickly occurred. Over time, this idea developed into a lively trade, leading to the establishment of the Hackhofer antique shop. A mail-order business started



in 1979 with the issuance of *Magic Literature List No. 1*, and grew into a well-known specialty antique shop for circus, magic, and variety.

The path dedicated to portraying the art of magic in history, to our bedrooms led through a library housing art, and literature. And in the same year, the first thousands of books spanning centuries, recounting the stories of famous performers, the genesis of the part of a bibliography of German magic literature was published. His passion for magic and circus was, for practical matters, relegated to free time after work and on weekends. Mostly supported by my mother, he spent evenings in the storeroom of the shop, creating catalogs, preparing items for shipping, or scouring auction catalogs for future acquisitions. As children, my brother and I helped by folding catalogs, copying His passion for magic, circus, or variety as my father, a large part of our lives remains connected to his collection. We hope that the pieces offered in this catalog will inspire the same enthusiasm in their new owners as they did for him.

1. ROGERS, John (American, 1829 – 1904). The Traveling Magician. New York, 1878. Attractive Victorian plaster sculpture showing an itinerant magician performing for three children. He produces a rabbit from his hat, while a secret assistant holds a pigeon behind the table, in readiness for the next trick. $15 \times 15 \frac{1}{2} \times 23$ ". Tiny chips and wear as usually encountered, but retaining an attractive vintage patina. An iconic piece of magic-themed art, and the most sought-after of all the "Rogers Groups."

Oil on canvas depicts a well-dressed conjurer producing a small bird from underneath a cover held in his hand; a small group of astonished spectators bear witness to the feat while gathered around a table in a tavern. A magic wand is gripped in the magician's free hand, and on the stool beside the table are other tools of the mountebank's trade including a playing cards, cups, a pistol, and a small cage for the bird. RARE GROUPING OF ROBERT-HOUDIN MYSTERY CLOCKS





22. Robert-Houdin Double Mystery Clock. Circa 1845. A "double" or "Series 3" mystery clock designed by Robert-Houdin featuring a glass dial in a gilt bezel with a single hand at its center, the dial supported by a clear glass tube above a gilt wooden and brass base. The clock keeps time and the hand moves despite no apparent connection to the mechanism concealed in the base. Roman hour markers with five division bits further subdivided into three units. Floral supports join the column to the dial concealing the driving gears, and four griffin heads support the base of the clear tube. He used this success as a catapult to further fame and built what would become the "wonder show of the universe" (the billing for his stage-filling illusion show) on the back of his long run at the Palace Theatre. It was also during this time that Thurston published his famous pitch book, Howard Thurston's Card Tricks. The first edition played on the motif and design of this throw out card. Thurston used these cards not for his manipulations, but as giveaways thrown with amazing accuracy to theatergoers watching his performance.

Objects placed in an opaque box can be instantly seen by the performer or his partner, even if the performer is in a separate room from the proceedings and box. Additional applications allow the performer to instantly know cards face down on a table from a distance of as far as 50 feet, cards face down in a box, every card held in another person's hand, what cards are coming off the top of the deck, or the identity of the hole card in Blackjack or Five Card Stud. It is equally easy to instantly and covertly obtain access to any information written on an opaque clipboard. The system can be used by one or two persons, is self-contained, sets up quickly and can be easily transported. Originally sold in limited quantities and includes all necessary apparatus (clipboard, two boxes, special cards), as well as electronic equipment, chargers, custom carrying case, and instructions.

Russ Walsh, a Chicago steel salesman, was also a polished semi-professional magician and was likely the first performer to present a golf-themed magic act aimed at the country club, resort, and hotel market. Jay Marshall presented a version of Wash's act on occasion, but it was Bergeron who developed the routine more fully and presented it most frequently. His first successes as a magician were as Rebo the Clown on the Magic Land of Alakazzam with Mark Wilson, but thanks to the creation of this golf act and other specialty turns, Bergeron enjoyed a long and successful career as a magician working for many years at Walt Disney World in Florida as part of the Diamond Horseshoe Review.

Only a few months after the performance advertised on this broadside, on May 9, 1911 during Lafayette's performance of his Lion's Bride illusion at the Empire Theatre Edinburgh, a lantern fell to the stage and ignited a blaze that destroyed the theater and many of the performers on stage. Lafayette managed to survive the blaze, but when he rushed back into the building to save his horse, he was killed. A body presumed to be the illusionist was discovered and sent to Glasgow for cremation but was later determined to be Lafayette's double. Once Lafayette's body was found, and after a funeral procession through the streets of the city attended by a reported 250,000 mourners, his ashes were interred in an urn in the same tiny coffin as his beloved dog, Beauty.
