

Developed to provide sound effects to silent films, Fotoplayers were essentially player pianos that required little to no musical skill to operate. While the musical soundtrack to the film was played on the piano via the traditional roll system (a two-roll setup allowed music to play continuously), various sound effects could be operated on cue by pushing buttons, pulling cords, and depressing levers incorporated into the player's cabinet. Approximately 10,000 of these instruments were constructed in a 13-year span, but only a handful have survived in playable condition. Production of the players ceased after talkies changed the course of movie making forever.
