



1. ACKERMANN, Rudolf (1764-1834). The Indian Jugglers. [London]: R. Ackermann, 101 Strand, 1813. Hand-colored etching depicting three performers on a platform. 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 10". A bit unevenly trimmed at edges. Sharp and clean with only minor spotting.

- 2. ALEXANDER (Claude Alexander Conlin, 1880-1954). **Two Typed Alexander Letters.** Los Angeles: 1921-1922. Including: a letter offering the book *The Life & Mysteries of the Celebrated Dr. Q.* On his personal stationery ("Alexander The Man Who Knows"). 11 x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Signed with an inkstamp on the lower right corner (toned, some edgewear, a few chips, 2 horizontal creases). [Together with:] Follow-up letter concerning *The Life & Mysteries of the Celebrated Dr. Q,* adding \$65 worth of books FREE, if the recipient adds an additional 50 cents for postage. On his personal stationery (a different design). 11 x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Signed in green ink on the lower right corner (toned, worn, chipped, several horizontal and vertical creases, some uneven sunning).

Photograph of a three-quarter length engraved portrait of the Scottish conjurer in cabinet card format, on a plain mount $6 \frac{1}{2} \times 4 \frac{1}{4}$ ". Chip in lower margin, else good.

THIS COPY SIGNED BY OVER 70 MAGICIANS WHO ATTENDED THE CONVENTION, including: Harlan Tarbell, Harry Blackstone, Ade Duval, Doc Nixon, T. Nelson Downs, A.M. Wilson, Floyd Thayer, Jack Gwynne, Percy Abbott, and many more. The International Brotherhood of Magicians is one of the largest fraternal organizations of magicians in the United States.



With printed caption: "Blackstone Worlds' Foremost Magician" (some edgewear, with some light chipping, lightly toned). INSCRIBED TO LOWER CENTER: "To "Lindhorst" One Horsethief to another Harry Blackstone 10-28-1945".

7. [BOOKPLATES]. [HOUDINI, Harry (1874-1926)]. A group of approximately 59 bookplates of magicians, magic shops, and magic collections, including a bookplate of Harry Houdini. Houdini bookplate: 4 x 3"; other bookplates generally similar sizes. Some bookplates with glue residue on versos (the Houdini bookplate is unused). Generally, very good or better. In addition to Houdini, other bookplates include: Robert Lund, the Milbourne Christopher Collection, The McManus/Young Collection at the Library of Congress, C.A. George Newmann, Stanley Collins, George L. Daily Jr., John Mulholland, J.B. Findlay, Virgil Anjos, Paul Fleming, and many more.

8. BUCHINGER, Matthew (1674-1740). **Two Matthew Buchinger Engravings**. One, a portrait of the celebrated "Little man of Nuremberg," published in 1804, and measuring 7 x 5". Some toning, right margin trimmed unevenly, one tear to upper margin, some edgewear. [Together with:] Matthew Buchinger portrait engraving. [London: R. Grave, ca. 1790]. Full-length image of Buchinger, who, despite being born without hands or feet, could execute trick bowling shots, engrave intricate portraits, and perform sleight-of-hand tricks. Upper and lower margins trimmed a bit close, with loss of caption beneath image. 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ ", mounted onto a larger sheet of paper (7 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ "). Bookseller's embossed stamp at upper right corner of mount, with a later (1859) gift inscription on verso, some soiling to mount. An excellent pair.

Engraved oversized banknote on onionskin-like paper, from Soo's illusion "The Dream of Wealth," in which heated milk transformed into coins, then into bank notes. $5 \frac{1}{2} \times 8 \frac{3}{4}$ ". Fold in lower right corner.



13. DOWNS, T. Nelson (1867-1938). Two Autograph Letters Signed to David P. Abbott. Both written in Downs' characteristic "whorly" script on Marshalltown, lowa Elks Home stationery, and describing in great detail the instructions for an effect called "The Spirit Aces." One letter is two pages in length, the other is three pages and are dated May 24 and 27, 1917, respectively. Three-hole punched at left edges, several creases, some mild wear. Good condition. Though Downs often boasted of his prowess as a sleight of hand artist, the effect he describes in these letters requires the use of a gimmicked card.

14. DUNNINGER, Joseph (1892-1975). Dunninger Bust by Rafael Santiago. Heavy plaster bust of the mind reader and magician sculpted by Rafael Santiago, bearing an engraved plaque below the likeness stating, "Joseph Dunninger / World Premier Mentalist / Magician, author, inventor, designer of spectacular illusions. Versatile teacher of mystery. Born April 28, 1892 Died March 9 1975 / Portrait executed by Santy the Magician." Height 16 ¾". One of three busts cast by Santiago. Minor wear and tiny chips; very good condition. This bust was done in tribute to "The Amazing Dunninger," the famous mentalist. He was one of the first mentalists to work on radio and television and was an avid debunker of fraudulent mediums.

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15. DUNNINGER, Joseph (1892-1975). A group of audio recordings of Dunninger. Including: 16 record albums (12" diameter) of one of Dunninger's radio appearances ("Blue Net," March 29, 1944). Each album in sleeve. Some rubbing. [Together with:] 2 record albums (16" diameter) of an appearance on Armed Forces Radio Service ("The Master Mentalist Dunninger"). Circa 1940s. In plain record sleeves (some wear). [Together with:] A group of 3 reel-to-reel tapes, 13 audio cassettes, 3 DVDs and 1 Sony Betamax tape of Dunninger's appearances and recordings. Some wear. An interesting group. Not tested for playback.

16. DUNNINGER, Joseph (1892-1975). Signed photograph of Dunninger and Houdini. Circa 1940. Black and white photograph (8 x 10"). Some toning, a few creases, some mild soiling, a few short marginal tears. Photo mounted onto paper and framed and glazed (frame size: 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 12"). INSCRIBED BY DUNNINGER: "For my Pal Bob Dunn from his friend Joe. Dunninger". Dunninger and Houdini were good friends, with a shared interest in debunking mediums. The recipient, Bob Dunn, was a famous cartoonist and illustrator.

Dunninger stands with Saram Ellison, Dr. Wilson, and Francis Martinka outside the famous New York magic emporium. Slightly toned, light edgewear, a few mild creases. Inscribed by Dunninger in the lower right corner: "To my friend Quod from one of the 4 / Dunninger".

19. [DUNNINGER] [DUNN, Robert (1908-1989), illustrator]. BELSON, Walter. Who Me? Drexel Hill: Bell Publishing, [1951]. 8vo. Illustrated by Dunn. Publisher's pictorial boards (some edgewear, toning); publisher's dust jacket (spine toned and worn, some edgewear, thumbsoiling, a few chips and tears). INSCRIBED BY DUNN TO HIS FRIEND, JOSEPH DUNNINGER, WITH AN ORIGINAL DRAWING OF DUNNINGER ON THE HALFTITLE: "Yes you Jolly Joe-The Greatest Friend I Have Thine – Bob Dunn". A good copy with an excellent inscription and association. Robert Dunn (1908-1989) was a cartoonist, magician and gag-writer. He is credited with inventing the modern "knock-knock" joke in 1936.

20. GOLDIN, Horace (1873-1939). Typed note signed ("Horace Goldin") to Joseph Dunninger, May 23, 1923. 1 page on plain white paper, with the typed return address of the Palace Hotel in New York City (8 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 11"). Mounted onto plain black paper on the left margin, a bit toned, some soiling, tape residue on right margin, some mild chipping, 1 horizontal and 2 vertical creases. "Dear Friend Dunningear [sic]: Very man thanks for your kind letter of sympathy. Sincerely yours, Horace Goldin". With the original mailing envelope from the Palace Hotel (some wear, ink notations). Goldin was a stage magician who was known for his rapid pace tricks; his version of the" sawing a woman in half" trick was one of his most famous illusions (he dispensed with placing the woman in a box – he had her entire body in full view of the audience, whilst a large buzzsaw "cut" her in half).

21. FLOSSO, Al (1895-1976), A group of Conev Island Fakir ephemera. Including: a 3-page type-written article about "Al Flosso, the coney island fakir" (author unknown); an 8-page (on 4 sheets) hand-written article about Flosso ("Flosso By The Sea"; author unknown); several notes written to various people on Flosso's behalf, on Flosso's stationery; an autograph note signed by Flosso about tickets; five 8 x 10" black and white photos of Flosso interacting with audience members and others (including Joseph Dunninger; two audience members are children) - two of the photos have photographer's credits on the verso; a small card of "Mme. Xenia - (mind-reading)" beneath it is written: "Mrs. Al Flosso"; and an advertising pamphlet for "Al Flosso Magical Entertainer and Punch and Judy Artist". Some general wear, soiling. A good group. A Coney Island legend, Flosso was famous for his "Miser's Dream" illusion of producing coins out of thin air (with a loud "clang" on a nearby bucket). He made several television appearances. including The Ed Sullivan Show (he was the first magician on that program), and The Steve Allen Show. He also appeared in the Marx Brothers film Monkey Business (1931). He also owned Martinka & Co. (later the Flosso/Hornman Magic Co.), the oldest magic company in the United States (at one point, it was co-owned by Harry Houdini).

22. FOX, Paul (1898-1976). A group of engraved business cards, and four sheets of personal stationery. Five business cards (all different designs), one business-card sized envelope, and stationery (each sheet with a different design). Some toning, light wear (envelope is quite worn). Very good. Fuchs was a well-known magician, designer of tricks, and a master engraver who designed and created each of these pieces of ephemeral advertising.



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

From the Radner collection, and formerly on display in the Houdini Historical Center in Outagamie, Wisconsin. Extended length 9 ½". Cuffs retain original museum tags. With key. Minor wear to plating. Working condition.

26. HOUDINI, Harry (Ehrich Weisz). Society of American Magicians Bank Document Signed ("Harry Houdini"). New York: June 5, 1920. Document issued by the Excelsior Savings Bank (New York), with the gilt seal of the Society of American Magicians applied, authorizing trustees Leo Rullman and William Berryman to utilize funds. SIGNED by Harry Houdini as President of the S.A.M. 12×7 ". Framed and matted, approx. sight $15 \frac{1}{2} \times 10 \frac{1}{2}$ ". Not examined out of frame.

The bank was ten blocks away from where Society of American Magicians was founded in 1902 in the back room of Martinka's Magic Shop. This certification is three years into Houdini's term as president of the society.

Dear Sir Will he dare to accept a challenge from us to bring along lumber and nails and construct a strong packing case on the stage in full view of the audience? We challenge him to let us tie his hands to his feet with strong tarred rope, as well as hand-outling him with chain and ball, place him in the box, nail on the cover, and nail the ropes arout he box. Very truly yours, Blipping Clarks Bull Buthers Union Square. Houdini has accepted the above challenge. The test will be on Thursday Evening, June 20, At KEITH & PROCTOR'S Union Square Theatre






29. HOUDINI, Harry (Ehrich Weisz). **Houdini – May Co.: Packing Case Challenge.** Allied Printing, 1908. Houdini challenged by the May Co. to escape one of their packing cases on stage in one of their athletic suits at Keith's Theatre in Cleveland, Ohio. Paper challenge (7 x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ "). Tear in the upper left corner and uneven cut along the top.

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30. HOUDINI, Harry (Ehrich Weisz). New York Hippodrome's Anniversary Playbill with Houdini Challenge. New York, 1918. Houdini accepted a challenge from the United States Tank Corps. to escape a full pool while upside down in a "restraint suit." 4to. Lacks covers; two pages separated near the center. Signed by Houdini.

31, HOUDINI, Harry (1874-1926), Houdini Challenge, Barnard's Woolwich. Woolwich: H. Pryce & Son, 1905. Letterpress challenge handbill (7 x 5") issued by H. C. Greenwood, Manager, challenging Houdini to escape from a trunk specially prepared by Greenwood - which was accepted by Houdini. Some toning, one small scuff mark near top (on the "i" of "Houdini").

32. HOUDINI, Harry (1874-1926). T Wharf Fishermen Challenge Houdini. Boston, 1911. Letterpress challenge handbill (10 x 3 1/2") issued by "Sea Captains and Fishermen" to lash Houdini to an eight-foot plank, with his knees fastened to a broom stick, etc. - which was accepted by Houdini, to be performed at B. F. Keith's Theatre. Some mild toning.

33. HOUDINI, Harry (1874-1926). A group of vintage and modern Houdini ephemera. Including: a black-and-white photo of Houdini (10 x 8", chipped with tears); a bookplate from Houdini's friend, Joseph Dunninger; a handbill for the Tony Curtis film about Houdini; a typescript of (supposedly) Houdini's impressions of Dunninger's methods (with a forged Houdini signature): various programs and handbills advertising Houdini's performances, and two framed printed illustrations of Houdini's methods from Houdini's Book of Magic (1927). 

40. HOUDINI, Harry (1874-1926). Typed Note Signed by Houdini. Baltimore: Nov. 13, 1925. 1 4to page on plain white paper (mild toning, soiling, rubbing, one horizontal and two vertical creases). Addressed: "Dear Lohrev:-" Written to Carl S. Lohrey, who built magical apparatus for Houdini and others: "I think you have the wrong slant about those clocks. All you would have to do is to have a push catch and the clocks would fall back. Have forgotten the full idea but if you send it to me I think I can have it finished around the show or give it to Schlosser to make. Please give me the full effect as I told it to you." Visible size: 10 x 8". Matted, framed and glazed, with a Houdini memorial stamp from 1951 (frame size: 22 ½ x 18 ½"). Minor rubbing to frame. Near fine. Provenance: Ken Klosterman's "Salon de Magie."

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35. HOUDINI, Harry (1874-1926). Movie still from Houdini's film, The Man from Beyond. [White Studio, 1922]. 9 x 7 ½". Tape reinforcement to margins, tape on front of photo, some ink color correction, toned, chipped, numerous inkstamps, ink notations, sticker residue on verso (including an ownership stamp from "World-Famed French Wizard Fred Beckman". In this silent film, Houdini portrays Howard Hillary, a man discovered frozen in Arctic ice who is brought back to life. This film was seen as a sort of apology to Houdini's erstwhile friend, Sir Arthur Conan Doyle (1859-1930); Houdini and Doyle had a falling out over spiritualism, which Doyle believed in, but Houdini did not. At the end of this film, there was a caption, "You must believe" in which one of the character's spirits migrates into another body, which Doyle later praised.





Will you please send me the two pieces of wood with the peculiar curve. Thanks." Visible size: 5 x 8". Matted, framed and glazed (frame size: 22 ½ x 18 ½"). Minor rubbing to frame. Near fine. 42. KALANAG (Helmut Schreiber). Kalanag's Touring Wardrobe Trunk. Circa 1950. Corrugated metal wardrobe owned and used by the German magician who performed before, during, and after WWII and was a favorite performer of Adolph Hitler. With internal bar for hanging theatrical wardrobe, upper lid, and second opening on long side. Height 58". Original locks cut away, a few hasps missing, and heavy wear from professional use. Used by Kalanag on his world tours.

43. KELLAR. Harry (1849-1922). Autograph Letter Signed from legendary magician Harry Kellar to fellow magician, Frederick Eugene Powell. Los Angeles, August 4, 1917, Kellar writes to the man who would succeed him as the Dean of American magicians regarding a possible upcoming meeting between the two, and a recent operation. 1 ½ pages on one folded sheet of Kellar's letterhead (each page 8 x 5 ½"). With original mailing cover. Light toning, wear, 1 horizontal crease to letter, wear, soiling to envelope. A near fine letter between 2 giants of American magic.

50. McCOMB, Billy (1922-2006). Brass "Titanic" ship's clock. Once labeled by McComb as being from the "Oak Room" of the *Titanic* (most of that label is missing). The Titanic was constructed in Belfast, Ireland, where Billy was born, and Billy claimed to have found the clock when he was younger. McComb later claimed it was authenticated as being made for the Titanic, but was either an unused spare, or was stolen from the ship, so it never "sailed." With a COA of the McComb Legacy Auction (lot #21) that this clock was part of that auction. Irish-born American magician and comedian, McComb was a frequent performer in film and television, and performed on cruise ships. He had a reputation for jokes, so it is likely that this clock was not actually from the Titanic. [Together with:] An award plaque to McComb from Siegfried and Roy at the Dedication of the 1997 Desert Magic Seminar. With COA.

51. [MCMANUS-YOUNG MAGIC COLLECTION]. Archive of letters, photographs, documents, and ephemera related to the McManus-Young Magic Collection. Including: correspondence between Morris N. Maro (1868-1908) was born Walter Truman Best in Montpelier, Vermont. Trained first as a photographer and musician, he eventually combined his abilities as a saxophonist with his aptitude for magic, after encouragement and coaching from Dr. A.M. Wilson of Kansas City, Missouri. One of the earliest and most successful magicians on the Lyceum circuits that toured rural America, Maro made a name for himself as a refined and artistic performer who presented a mixed bill of hand shadows, conjuring, and music, and such was his reputation that at one time, it was suggested that he might succeed the great Harry Kellar. Sadly, Maro's career - and life - was cut short at the age of thirty-nine by typhoid fever, in 1908. Friend and fellow Lyceum magician Eugene Laurant took over Maro's route.

Disquisitionum Magicarum Libri Sex was originally printed in three volumes in 1599 and 1600. This text is an inquisitorial treatise on the prosecution of witchcraft including sexual unions between witches and demons.

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
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








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
