



Poster advertising the addition of the Boeing 707 to Air France's fleet, with daily non-stop flights to Paris in 6 ¹/₂ hours. Jet service between New York and Paris began in January, 1960. By the following year, the airline had seventeen 707s in service. 45 x 29 ³/₄". Linen backed. Scattered expertly restored losses and tears around edges. B+. 250/350

7. MORAN, Thomas (1837-1926). Yellowstone Park / Northern Pacific. 1924. St. Paul: Brown & Bigelow. 29 3/8 x 39 5/8". Rail travel poster showing the Grand Canyon of Yellowstone Park by Moran, a Hudson River School landscape painter. Emblems of the Northern Pacific Railway in corners. Yellowstone National Park was on Northern Pacific's main line. The railroad was the first to reach the park, at the north entrance, in 1883. Linen backed. Scattered over-painting in margins, with slight restoration to text at lower right. B+.



Color lithograph poster depicting the establishment of Fort Prince George, the site of what would later be Pittsburgh, at the confluence of the Allegheny and Monongahela Rivers. Wyeth was one of the most popular American book and magazine illustrators of the early twentieth century. Four of Wyeth's paintings were featured in PRR's poster series (Pittsburgh; Washington, D.C.; Kentucky; and Philadelphia). 40 ³/₄ x 27 ⁵/₈". Linen backed. 






