Framed with museum quality non-glare glass, overall 36 x 26". Provenance: with original bill of sale from the publisher, Little Brown and Company, sold to Robin L. Jacobson on 27 September 1982; original limitation tag affixed to frame verso. This deluxe lithographic poster was issued as a more affordable product and was intended to be almost indistinguishable from an original photograph which Ansel Adams then approved, signed and numbered each print. Liborio Noval was one of the earliest and most celebrated photographers of the Cuban Revolution. He became particularly famous for his intimate portraits of Fidel Castro and Che Guevara at home - portraits many critics charged amounted to little more than propaganda for the Cuban regime. In addition to his work in Cuba, Noval also worked as a war correspondent in Vietnam and Nicaragua. His photographs have won numerous prizes around the world, and were prominently featured in A Hundred Images of the Cuban Revolution.

23. ODIORNE, William C. (American, 1881-1978). Paris, photographed by William C. "Cicero" Odiorne. 1925. A collection of 35 different Parisian views by American artist/ photographer William Odiorne. Each 5 x 7". Odiorne worked as a photographer in Boston, Chicago and New York before moving to Paris, photographing that city. He became friends with William Faulkner, whom he photographed. Each photograph in this collection is stamped on verso with French copyright imprint reading: "Depose a la Bibliotheque Nationale - Copyrighted 1925 by W. C. Odiorne," along with an image number. Signed in the negative. His photographs are held in the collections of the Center for Creative Photography at the University of Arizona, the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston, New Orleans Museum of Art, Canadian Center for Architecture, and others. Osvaldo Salas emigrated from Havana to New York City when he was fourteen years old. After working odd jobs at Madison Square Garden he took to photographing boxing matches, which allowed him access to some of the most famous fighters in the world. His first photograph to appear in a major publication was of Rocky Marciano's nose following his second bout with Ezzard Charles on September 17, 1954. He was assigned to photograph Fidel Castro upon his first visit to the United States in 1955 - an assignment which would prove fateful for both men. Salas and his son, Roberto, were invited to visit Castro in Havana shortly after, and for the next four years Osvaldo and Roberto traveled back and forth between the United States and Cuba to photograph the Cuban guerillas' progress against the regime of Fulgencio Batista. Two days after the guerillas declared victory. Osvaldo and Roberto moved to Havana for good, with Roberto accepting the position of Fidel Castro's official photographer. Between the two men an invaluable record of Cuba's first years following Batista's fall was compiled. The photographs they took - including of the first and only meeting between Fidel Castro and Ernest Hemingway, the aftermath of the ill-fated Bay of Pigs invasion, and of Ernesto "Che" Guevara and others - have become iconic in their own right. Their works have since been exhibited in dozens of joint and solo exhibitions around the world and have appeared in numerous books about the Cuban Revolution.

Built in 1840, "Success" never actually carried prisoners; it was used as a shipping vessel and as a passenger ship. As a "floating museum," "Success" toured around the world for decades, showing the supposed horrors of old time convict ships. One of its last public displays was at the 1933 Chicago World's Fair.

After the death of Sam Giancana, Aiuppa became boss of the Outfit which grew stronger ties to its Las Vegas casinos under his command. These ties to Las Vegas were later the basis for Martin Scorcese's 1995 film Casino.

The Juvenile Protective Association was founded in Chicago in 1901 by Jane Addams, best known for her work with the city's legendary Hull House. From its inception well into the 1940s the JPA conducted research into social problems relating to juvenile delinquency as well as providing direct services. Among its caseworkers was Kate Falconer, who in addition to her work with the JPA also worked closely with Addams and other suffragettes in furtherance of women's rights. On July 24, 1915 she was among the first caseworkers to provide direct aid to survivors of the Eastland disaster and in its aftermath worked with families of the victims. The complaint blanks and county jail cases contained in this archive provide invaluable testament to the work she did for her community.

On July 4, 1940 an explosive device was discovered at the New York City World's Fair's British Pavilion. The bomb exploded while two New York City police officers were attempting to defuse it, killing both instantly and injuring dozens of others. In response Mayor Fiorello La Guardia and James Pyke of the New York City Fire Department collaborated on a device which would be able to safely remove explosives from public spaces to be defused in less populated areas.

In 1879. Fiske moved to Yosemite after both apprenticing and working with two early Yosemite photographers. Charles L. Weed and Carleton E. Watkins, becoming the Valleys first year-round resident photographer after a long hiatus in his career. Upon Fiske's death in 1918, the celebrated American landscape photographer, Ansel Adams, suggested that Fiske's remaining negatives acquired by the Yosemite Park Company be stored in the Yosemite Museum's fireproof basement, but his request was ignored and the negatives laid neglected in a sawmill attic which burned in 1943. "If that hadn't happened", said Adams, "Fiske could have been revealed today, I firmly believe, as a top photographer, a top interpretive photographer. I really can't get excited at [Carleton] Watkins and [Eadweard] Muybridge-I do get excited at Fiske. I think he had the better eye." (Hickman & Pitts, 1980). Adams was unguestionably influenced by the early American photographer's landscape views; using many of Fiske's inspirations in his own work when visiting the park for the first time in 1916 (See Ansel Adams' "El Capitan", printed 1952).

The trip then concludes along the Yukon River as Sickler and crew head to Dawson aboard a steamer ship. "The tenderfoot of the Wooly West have become the 'Chechako' of the icy North. The photographs in these albums present a fascinating view into a bygone era of California history. Settlers were granted overland railroad access to the west coast with the completion of the Pacific Railroad in 1869 and in droves they went, seduced by the promise of cheap land and grand adventures. San Francisco became a major financial hub, as old and new wealth alike settled in the rolling hills of the City by the Bay. With new wealth came new investment. The Hotel del Monte, once one of the finest hotels in all of North America, existed in its first incarnation for only seven short years, from 1880-1887, before burning to the ground in a catastrophic fire. Development began on Golden Gate Park in 1871, and today it is the third most visited public park in the United States. With these exciting new developments came a slew of photographers eager to document every minute detail of life on the Golden Coast, among them Carleton Watkins, Isaiah West Taber, and C.W.J. Johnson. The photographs which they and others took during this time provide an invaluable glimpse into these changes, as well as a unique insight into the lives of those who made them happen.

Over the course of a military career spanning several decades he participated in over sixty battles, and for his military valor he was named Commander-in-Chief of the British Army. With a lifetime batting average rivaled only by Ty Cobb, Roger Hornsby's major league career lasted twenty-three seasons and spanned five baseball teams, including the Chicago Cubs and the St. Louis Cardinals. Following his retirement he briefly managed the St. Louis Browns and then the Cincinnati Reds. To date, he is the only ball player to have hit 40 home runs and batted .400 in a single season. He was inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame in 1942, only five years after his retirement.

Fred C. Clarke began his career with the Louisville Colonels in 1894 and in his first game for the team collected five hits in five at bats, a record still unbroken in Major League Baseball. Three years later he assumed manager duties in addition to playing, and when he joined the Pittsburgh Pirates in 1900 he filled the same roles. Of the nine pennants won in the history of the Pirates franchise, Clarke was player-manager for four of them.

George Brace became a baseball photographer at the tender age of 16 after being taken on as an apprentice to a photographer who had been contracted to photograph the Chicago Cubs. Over the course of a career lasting 65 years Brace witnessed Babe Ruth's legendary called shot and photographed Jackie Robinson during his debut season with the Brooklyn Dodgers, as well as construction of the scoreboard and bleachers along with the installation of the famed ivy at Wrigley Field.

Ike Weir was the first man to take the Featherweight Champion of the World title, besting Frank Murphy on March 31, 1889 in a highly publicized match which lasted an incredible eighty rounds. He would lose the title to "Torpedo" Billy Murphy early the following year, however Weir would then defeat Murphy during a rematch which saw the Belfast Spider knock the Torpedo clear out of the ring. He would retire with a professional record of twenty-six wins, two losses, and nine draws.

Known as the Pottawatomie Giant, Jess Willard became an international sensation when on April 5, 1915, he knocked out heavyweight champion Jack Johnson in the 26th round before a huge crowd in Havana, Cuba. Willard defended his title the following year in a bout against Frank Moran on March 25, 1916 at Madison Square Garden. The end came on July 4. 1919, in a fight against Jack Dempsey in Toledo, Ohio. It is said during this bout that Willard lost several teeth and suffered a broken jaw and three broken ribs. Dempsey won the title in the fourth round, though Willard's refusal to give up even after the beating he'd suffered is today considered to be one of the most impressive displays of perseverance in boxing history.

Sixty years later she was honored with a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame, making her the earliest-born recipient.

The Gayety Theatre opened in 1909, and for the first few years of its existence operated as a legitimate theatre house. Within a few years, however, the theatre shifted its focus to burlesque and vaudeville acts, with Al Jolson, Sophie Tucker, and Carrie Finnell gracing its stage at various points. Its reputation for bawdy performances caused the city of Minneapolis to shut it down in 1928, and it was only after the city extracted a promise from its owner to clean up its act that it was allowed to reopen. In addition to his editorial work he wrote and published his own novels and plays, created a software program for aspiring writers called WritePro, and worked extensively with Voice of America as a script writer.

The clipper ship Hornet was bound for San Francisco from New York City when on May 3, 1866, she caught fire and sank in the Pacific Ocean. The crew escaped the blaze in three lifeboats. only one of which made landfall after forty-three days on the open sea. The lifeboat landed in Hawaii, then known as the Sandwich Islands, where a young Mark Twain was working as a correspondent for the Sacramento Daily Union. Upon hearing of the harrowing tale Twain rushed to the hospital where the survivors were recovering, and after interviewing them stayed up all night writing the story, then just made it in time to deliver his copy onto a ship bound for San Francisco the next day. The story was published in Harper's New Monthly Magazine in December 1866, and for the rest of his life Twain would refer to Forty-Three Days in an Open Boat as the piece which launched his literary career. However, due to the rushed writing the editors of Harper's were unable to read Twain's longhand and printed the story as being the work of "Mark Swain."

Published with an eye on the great social changes reverberating through the American cultural landscape in the early 1960s, Ralph Ginzburg's Eros might have fallen under the authorities' radar entirely had the decision not been made to publish the last studio portraits of Marilyn Monroe in their autumn, 1962 issue. H. Rider Haggard began writing Cetywayo and His White Neighbours while studying for the Bar in 1881. The book tells the story of Cetywayo, ruler of the Zulu Kingdom from 1873-1879. Throughout the second half of the nineteenth century the British established numerous colonies bordering native African kingdoms, the Zulu among them. After diamonds were discovered nearby British territorial governors hatched a scheme to create a new confederation in South Africa. with a ruling class of whites who would govern the larger native African population. Cetywayo was considered to be one of the greatest obstacles to this plan, as evidenced in a letter written to the 4th Earl of Carnarvon by Sir Theophilus Shepstone which calls Cetywayo "the secret hope of every petty independent chief...who feels a desire that his color shall prevail, and it will not be until this hope is destroyed that they will make up their minds to submit to the rule of civilisation." The Anglo-Zulu War which resulted saw Cetywayo deposed and led directly to the Boer Wars, establishing the nation of South Africa on what was once Zulu and Boer land. Despite his ultimate defeat at the hands of the British Cetywayo became something of a folk hero, with Haggard himself including him as a character in three of his own novels: The Witch's Head, Black Heart and White Heart, and Finished. Haggard sent his finished manuscript for Cetywayo and His White Neighbours off to numerous publishers but received only one offer, from Trubner and Company who offered to print 750 copies for the price of fifty pounds. The book ultimately sold only 154 copies with the remainder presumably lost, making it one of the more scarce titles of Haggard's literary output.

From there Berg would branch out into other ventures, among them Stan Lee's Timely (later Marvel) Comics and Bill Gaines's infamous EC Comics. In 1957 Berg was offered a more steady job writing and illustrating for MAD Magazine, and four years later he introduced "The Lighter Side...", which would ultimately become one of MAD's most popular features.

Considered to be the first female sociologist, Harriet Martineau began publishing in earnest at the age of 27 after her family's textile business closed. Her ensuing fame allowed her to move to London in 1832, where she made the acquaintance of Elizabeth Barrett Browning, John Stuart Mill, Sydney Smith, George Eliot, and Charles Dickens. In addition to her sociological works she wrote numerous novels and religious texts, and her contributions to British society were such that she was invited by Princess Victoria to her 1838 coronation.

The tensions became such that in 1836 Caroline left her husband, living off of her own earnings as a writer. George Luther Stearns first made a name for himself as an industrialist whose trade was in sheet metal and pipe-lead. He established the Medford station of the Underground Railroad and was one of the "Secret Six" financiers who funded John Brown's raid on Harper's Ferry in 1859. He is also credited with having raised 13,000 African American recruits for the Union cause during the Civil War.

Captain Sir Thomas Staines joined the British Navy when he was thirteen years old and within seven years was commissioned a lieutenant aboard the HMS Peterel under Commander Philip Wodehouse. In 1807 he was appointed commander of the HMS Cyane, and in 1809 Staines found himself in a heated battle in Naples Bay with the French frigate Cerere as well as twenty gunboats. Despite exhausting all of the Cyane's ammunition the crew forced the French into a hasty retreat, albeit at the cost of many lives and one of Staines's arms. Upon his return to England Staines was knighted by King George III. In later years he would command the HMS Briton which in 1814 would encounter John Adams, last surviving mutineer from the HMS Bounty, on Pitcairn Island, and despite an active warrant for his arrest Staines opted to leave him in peace due to his missionary work with the island's natives.
