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

2. Oriental Twin Die Boxes. Peoria Heights: Michael Baker/The Magic Company, 2000s. A large block placed within one of the two boxes can appear or disappear at will. Tray with built-in "sucker" sliding sound effect. 12 x 7 x 8". Very good. 200/400

3. Sliding Ball Cabinet. Peoria Heights: Michael Baker/The Magic Company, 2000s. A ball placed within the cabinet can be made to vanish at will, then appear elsewhere. Clever method. $8 \times 5 \times 5 \frac{1}{2}$ ". Very good.

4. Oriental "Peek" Die Box. Peoria Heights: Michael Baker/ The Magic Company, 2000s. A large block placed in the box is made to vanish and appear elsewhere. Incorporates clever method for sliding sound effect. 11 x 6 x 6". Very good.

5. Shenanigan Die Box. Peoria Heights: Michael Baker/The Magic Company, 2000s. A large white die vanishes from within the wooden box and appears elsewhere. In the style of Abbott's "Shenanigan Die Box". 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 7". Very good.

6. Time and Again. Peoria Heights: Michael Baker/The Magic Company, 2000s. Two examples. A variation of Mazda Magic's "Watch Out". A large pocket watch vanishes, then reappears hanging inside of the cabinet. Height 11" and 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".









13. **Oriental Drawer Box.** Peoria Heights: Michael Baker/T Magic Company, 2000s. A number of silks or other small ite are produced from an oriental-themed wooden drawer that h previously been shown empty. 7 $\frac{1}{2} \times 4 \frac{7}{8} \times 10 \frac{3}{4}$ ".

8. **Oriental Lippincott Box.** Peoria Heights: Michael Baker/ The Magic Company, 2000s. A borrowed watch or other small object vanishes and is later found locked within a decorated wooden box. Very good. $4 \frac{1}{2} \times 6 \times 4 \frac{1}{2}^{"}$.

9. **Oriental "Find the Lady" Cubes.** Peoria Heights: Michael Baker/The Magic Company, 2000s. A monte-style effect using three stacked blocks with playing card faces printed on them, based on the Thayer original. Oriental theme to box and blocks. $4 \frac{1}{4} \times 4 \frac{1}{4} \times 14$ ".

10. **Block Off Rod Penetration.** Peoria Heights: Michael Baker/ The Magic Company, 2000s. A wooden block is pulled free from a solid rod threaded through the box it rests in, then replaced at will. 

29. Jumbo Twin Tube Penetration. Cashmere, WA: Magic House of Babcock, 2000s. A large red wooden block, placed into one of the two wooden tubes, penetrates a solid plastic plate separating them. Height 20" overall.

30. Miraculous Production. Peoria Heights: Michael Baker/ The Magic Company, 2000s. Livestock, or a large number of silks, can be produced from the oriental styled wooden box resting on a three-fold wooden stand. Rolling casters at base. Height 42". Near fine.

32. Astro Ball Cabinet. Peoria Heights: Michael Baker/The Magic Company, 2000s. A yellow ball jumps into a small glass when both are placed in a decorative cabinet and the door is closed, then reopened. $9 \times 10 \times 3 \frac{1}{2}$ ". Very good.

33. See Through Production Box. Peoria Heights: Michael Baker/The Magic Company, 2000s. A decorative box is opened on all sides to be shown empty and yet, a large number of silks can be produced from within. Height 9". Very good.

34. Spider Square Circle. Peoria Heights: Michael Baker/The Magic Company, 2000s. Many silks or other small items are produced from within two large spider-themed tubes shown empty and placed on a thin stand. Height 15". Very good. 300/400

35. Art Deco Style Square Circle. Peoria Heights: Michael Baker/The Magic Company, 2000s. Many silks or other small items are produced from within the nested tubes. Outer wooden tube is intricately cut with a Deco flamingo design. Height 12". Good.

36. Gwynne Spectacular Rabbit Vanish. Peoria Heights: Michael Baker/The Magic Company, 2000s. A live rabbit placed into the decorative oriental box vanishes a la the Die Box; after comedy "by-play," all doors are opened to show it has vanished. 14 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 10 x 8". Good.

37. Watch Target. Peoria Heights: Michael Baker/The Magic Company, 2000s. A borrowed watch vanishes, then reappears in the center of the wooden target on command. Height 34". Good.

38. Oriental Twin Nested Boxes. Peoria Heights: Michael Baker/The Magic Company, 2000s. A borrowed object that was previously vanished, reappears within two, locked, oriental decor boxes. 5 ½ x 5 x 5". Very good. One of two made.

39. Oriental Cube to Silk Tray. Peoria Heights: Michael Baker/ The Magic Company, 2000s. A large oriental cube instantly and visibly changes into a silk or other small object when dropped on the tray. 11 ½ x 11 ½". Good.

40. Anastasia's Lost Treasure. Peoria Heights: Michael Baker/ The Magic Company, 2017. A variation on the seldom seen Thayer effect, "The Boxes of Choy Fong". One of two sets. 11 x 15 x 11". Very good.

41. Alexi's Secret Box. Peoria Heights: Michael Baker/The Magic Company, 2000s. A Die Box featuring Russian fairy tale imagery and a small yellow box in place of the traditional die. $10 \times 5 \times 5 \frac{1}{8}$ ". Very good. Uncommon.

42. Weaver's House. Peoria Heights: Michael Baker/The Magic Company, 2000s. A spider weaves a web within the cabinet out of the yarn color chosen by the audience. Height 17 ³/₄". Very good.

43. Skeleton Side Tables. Alabama: The Magic Company (Michael Baker), ca. 2010. Magician's collapsible side tables depicting skeletons who are holding their own skulls. Felted rectangular tops. Height 33". Tops 18 x 12". Very good. 300/500

44. Four Wrongs Make a Right. Alabama: The Magic Company (Michael Baker), ca. 2010. Four times in a row, the magician incorrectly guesses the card selected by spectator - but upon showing the opposite side of the stand, reveals the correct card in jumbo size. Painted wooden stand. Height 18 ¹/₂". Fine. 100/200

45. Die and Silk Casket. Alabama: The Magic Company (Michael Baker), ca. 2010. A die placed in a hat changes places with a silk handkerchief placed in the wooden stand. Produced in the Okito style. Height 19 ¹/₂". Die 4".

46. Hindoo Inkwell. Alabama: The Magic Company (Michael Baker), ca. 2010. Recreation of an Okito prop. A borrowed watch transforms into a potato when placed in the cabinet. Cutting open the potato reveals a key that opens a locked box, inside of which is the watch. 13 x 6 x 6".

47. Zombie Cabinet. Alabama: The Magic Company (Michael Baker), ca. 2010. Wooden cabinet in which a ball appears, then rises up and floats about. With black art panel to facilitate the addition of the Zombie gimmick. Designed in the Okito style. Maker's gilt plaque to rear. 13 $\frac{1}{4} \times 8 \frac{3}{4} \times 10 \frac{3}{4}$ ".

48. Den-O-Zen. Colon: Abbott's Magic Mfg., 1970s. Openended box on low base is shown empty, yet a gigantic production is made from within, including live doves. Multiple load chambers and clever construction to conceal same. Length 17". Redecorated with decals by Michael Baker. Decals chipping, else very good.

49. Doves on Perch. Indiana, PA: Bob Kline, 1970s. A pair of doves appears perched inside of a plexiglass walled box, previously shown empty. Repainted by Michael Baker/The Magic Company. Height 17".

50. Jewel Chest Mystery. Indiana, PA: Bob Kline, ca. 1985. Kline's version of Okito's Mandarin's Dream. Four "jewel boxes" are shown in a large cabinet. They magically transpose with a Geisha-type doll covered by an ornate tube, resting on a table some distance away. Cabinet 24 x 15 ½ x 32" resting on its own table, standing 33" high. Height of smaller table 32". Minor wear to paint; very good overall. One of only three units manufactured by Kline.

51. Swirl-It Box. Indiana, PA: Bob Kline, 1970s. Empty cabinet suspended from a rope is spun, instantly filling with silks or even a live dove. 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 5 $\frac{3}{4}$ x 10". Painted in the Okito style by Norm Nielsen. Very good.

52. Skunky Monkey. West Richland: Wolf's Magic, 2000s. A modernized version of Jack Hughes' Roamin Rabbit. The audience tries to decipher whether your assistant is a Skunk or Monkey while hiding within his tree stump hutch. Includes "Tail from Pocket" gimmick. Height 11". Very good.

56. Wacky Weasel. West Richland: Wolf's Magic, 2000s. An action packed variation of the classic Jack Hughes Snake 53. Wacky Water Wheel. West Richland: Wolf's Magic, 2000s. Basket featuring Wesley, your performing weasel assistant. An updated version of Wizzy Dizzy Milk with a kicker ending. Height 11". Very good. Includes six plastic cups and glitter. Height 12". 54. Crazy Coop. West Richland: Wolf's Magic, 2000s. Sydney the Psychic Chicken performs a handful of effects and wacky gags, concluding with a "barn burning" revelation of a chosen card. Includes all accessories and charging cable. Number 2 from a limited edition. Height 13". Very good.

55. The Roag Toad. West Richland: Wolf's Magic, 2000s. Roagie the toad helps teach kids to "catch the reading bug" by revealing what he previously ate for lunch. Height 17 1/2". Very good.



57. **Eye Gotcha.** West Richland: Wolf's Magic, 2000s. A standup version of the classic Dizzy Arrow with a "crazy eyes" kicker finish. Height 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Very good.

58. **The Cellulator**. West Richland: Wolf's Magic, 2000s. A modernized variation of the "Wiz Kote" routine in which a borrowed phone is burned and restored within a wild, smoke and siren filled contraption. With carrying case and all accessories. Height 7". Very good.

59. The Wacky Worm. West Richland: Wolf's Magic, 2000s. Your worm assistant deciphers which colored flat "ball" the audience is thinking of. Antics ensue. Height 14". 63. Wacky Wolf Funhouse. West Richland: Wolf's Magic, 2000s. The crank is turned and a large balloon pops within the Funhouse, leaving a live animal in its place. Some repairs. Height 14".

69. Ultimate Ring Grinder. West Richland: Wolf's Magic, 2000s. A borrowed ring is ground into golden dust in this "high tech polishing device" with flashing lights and loud cranks. 4 x 5 x 4 ½". Fine.

70. Micro ABC Re-Combobulator. West Richland: Wolf's Magic, ca. 2010. A miniature square circle prop with a bubblegum theme. From a limited edition. 3 x 3 x 6". Hallmarked, signed and numbered by the builder. Very good.

71. Blades of the Dragon. West Richland: Wolf's Magic, 2000s. A Chinese themed glass, display stand, and chopsticks, prepared for the classic razor blade swallowing illusion. Number 2 from the limited edition. Hallmarked. 10" overall. Very good.

72. Sneeky Snake. West Richland: Wolf's Magic, 2000s. A "packs flat" version of the snake basket with multiple visual gags, ending with the revelation of a chosen colored disc. Height 11". Very good.

77. The Groove Tube. West Richland: Wolf's Magic, 2000s. A colored plastic ball penetrates a solid acrylic rod, changes color, and shoots out of the tube. 10 ¹/₄" overall. Very good. 200/250

78. For All Eternity. West Richland: Wolf's Magic, 2000s. A photo is removed from a wooden frame, vanishes in a flash of fire, then slowly reappears within the frame. From an edition of 24 units. Frame 10 ¹/₂". Very good.

79. Sobriety Test. West Richland: Wolf's Magic, 2000s. A cup stacking competition between an audience member and the magician occurs on a rolling table under the guise of performing a sobriety test. Ending with a spectator's key ending up in the magician's wallet. Includes all accessories and ATA travel case. Very good.

80. Jumbo Balloon Wand. West Richland: Wolf's Magic, 2000s. An updated version of the Warren Stephens Card in Balloon routine featuring a giant magician's wand to hold the balloons and jumbo deck houlette. Wand length 30". Very good. 400/600

81. A-B-C Gumball Recombobulator. West Richland, WA: Wolf's Magic, ca. 2001. Modernized Square Circle built on the theme of "already been chewed" gumballs; cabinet outfitted with ringing bells, crank, and other mechanisms; load chamber produces giant gumballs at conclusion. With all accessories and instructions. Height 17 ¹/₄". Very good.

82. Blow Yur Stack. West Richland, WA: Wolf's Magic, 2000s. Magician and spectator compete to stack cups on a stand designed to resemble a block of cheese; the spectator's stack continually falls over. A mouse puppet pops out of the board, apparently responsible for foiling the spectator's attempts, then vanishes and reappears on the spectator's back. Length of board 22 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". With all accessories and mouse. Near fine. 600/1,200





83. Miniature Card Ladder. West Richland, WA: Wolf's Magic, 2000s. Height 29". Based on the P&L/Chapman original. A miniature pack of cards is set in a houlette atop the small wooden and brass ladder. On command, the cards cascade down the ladder, but three selections remain stuck in the rungs. One of 19 units constructed. Height 29". Houlette repaired, else very good.

84. Chicken Sword. West Richland, WA: Wolf's Magic, ca. 2003. A chosen card appears in the mouth of a rubber chicken when the cards spring - apparently of their own accord from a bucket of chicken on the performer's table. With all accessories, chickens, and instructional VHS tape. Signed by the maker. Very good.

85. Champagne Bucket Coin Pail (Prototype). West Richland, WA: Wolf's Magic, 2000s. Silver-plated champagne bucket with concealed coin droppers in base. A prototype developed by Wolf's Magic but never advertised for sale. Height 10". Signed and identified by the maker. Near fine.

86. Chompers. West Richland, WA: Wolf's Magic, 2000s. Educational magic trick about personal hygiene involving a cartoonish set of "chompers" with three bad teeth, which vanish from a pillow-like bag, then reappear (without decay), in the mouth. The routine ends with the production of a giant toothbrush from the pillow. Complete with all accessories. One of a limited number produced; as new.

87. Disecto. Bideford: Supreme Magic, ca. 1980. Wolf's repainted version of the classic hand chopper invented by Lester Lake. Height 16 3/4". Signed by Wolf, who repainted the prop in 2003. A few chips to finish.

88. Deluxe Elephant Table. West Richland, WA: Wolf's Magic, ca. 2010. Magician's center table in the form of three bull elephants supporting a 20 x 30" oval micro suede-covered top. 22k gold leaf finish accented with brass studs. Height 33". One of nine units manufactured. Hallmarked by the manufacturer. Very good.

89. Happy Hyena. West Richland, WA: Wolf's Magic, 2000s. Wolf's version of Milbourne Christopher's Forgetful Freddy. The hyena's head sways back and forth as he laughs, then falls off. Replaced by a balloon, the head vanishes, then reappears, popping the balloon in the process. Height 19 1/2". A few scuffs, else good.

90. Hip Hop Magician. West Richland, WA: Wolf's Magic. 2000s. Updated version of the Hippity Hop Rabbits in which the magician and his assistant change places under two covers; when the audience thinks it has caught on, the backs of each plaque are revealed to make up the face of a rabbit. Height 17". Near fine.

91. Ka-Blammo. West Richland, WA: Wolf's Magic, 2000s. A handkerchief printed to represent a stick of dynamite is placed in an open-front box and the plunger atop it is pushed; sparks fly and the box collapses, revealing a dog, birds, or another large object on the base where the box once stood. Height 46". With DVD, silks, and accessories. One of 18 units constructed. As new.

92. The Outhouse. West Richland, WA: Wolf's Magic, 2000s. Reimagined version of the Seabrooke/Malloy Chattering Teeth routine. A set of chattering teeth set inside the miniature outhouse shreds a roll of toilet paper to reveal a selected card; in the process, the house then explodes and paper flies about, and smoke is emitted from the house. Handcrafted from hardwood, height 19". With all accessories and CD of production photos. Hallmarked. In a sturdy wood carrying case, as issued. One of 25 units constructed. Near fine.

93. Run Wolf Run. West Richland, WA: Wolf's Magic, 2000s. Version of Harry Leat's Run Rabbit Run designed with a wolf and chicken coop theme; the wolf runs from one coop to the other, and at the end, the wolf vanishes and reappears elsewhere. Length 23". As new.

94. Sassy Silk. West Richland, WA: Wolf's Magic, 2000s. Oneman dancing silk routine, in which the yellow handkerchief cavorts about the miniature stage, vanishes, reappears, and darts out from various locations in and around the stage. 16 x 11 x 11". Near fine.
